#### Q11. Open ended positive responses

- Needless to say it makes a tremendous difference when forming a decision to pursue a desired path in education for students to save hundreds of dollars in not needing to buy much needed books and supplies.
- I have gone through entire courses without buying the textbooks because I couldn't afford them.
- The textbooks have been clear and concise in their teachings and I am more inclined to register for a course with open education than one that does not include it.
- The accessibility was appreciated!
- I enjoyed the accessibility of the courses. I think open learning services allow for more students to access the course material and to have a more affordable education especially if the book is only going to be used for 1 course
- Having a pdf copy of the textbook makes it much more accessible to search for specific chapters and concepts than physical copy textbooks.
- There is less stress to use free online textbooks as you do not have to worry about getting the wrong edition to save money with the risk of missing updated information.
- It would be a lot less stressful for students if they did not have to worry about affording resources for a course they already paid too much tuition for
- It was much easier to get started with the courses when I didn't have to worry about purchasing a textbook. However the lab
  component of an open education class made it far more expensive than any of my other courses, so I didn't see any real benefit for the
  one course.
- As a facet of creating a system that allows more equitable access to post-secondary education, open education resources are a valuable resource. However, free access to printed versions of digital documents could prove equally helpful to those who struggle to learn from text on a screen, but cannot afford or do not have ready access to printers (particularly when very large documents are being distributed.)
- Am very impressed with the local BC provincial content. My only complaint is that the materials for each course are organized completely differently; it would be easier if there was some continuity and common structure when working online with the material. Even the process for submitting assignments is different in each class.

#### Q11. Open ended critical responses

- There has been less than 10% of my courses which had Open Education Resources
- Not clearly identify or told to students that OE is a thing and is being used in a class
- Oddly enough, It's definitely been harder to get things done on my own time and **it's harder for me to learn from an** online textbook then it is from a paper book
- My only complaint is weak proofreading. Both times I've used an OE textbook it has had many basic, easilynoticed errors in the writing. I actually love proofreading and would be happy to do some for a small fee, but regardless, someone with a careful eye (other than the authors) should really do it. And if someone has been doing it, maybe get someone else? In all other ways the experience has been very practical. Thank you for taking the feedback!
- The quality of the content is noticeably lower than that of any of the traditional texts I have used. This is primarily due to grammatical errors, punctuation not corrected by editing, and occasionally poor writing style. My only experience with open learning texts has been Physical Geology for GEOL1111.
- I am not a fan of e-textbooks and love when I have the option to buy the actual text
- There are very little open educational resources available for social work
